The design will be showcased at the fairs, with a nod in the display to the company's 'growing roots.'



The Pl chair further develops the growing Pl collection.

Standing for 'polished imperfect,' the PI collection reflects nature's design, with smooth curves and slight irregularities that celebrate the natural character of the solid wood.

The PI chair is being launched in solid oak, sourced from European forests.



Not just designed for residential settings, the two versions of the chair passed contract grade testing in March and will be available soon to the contract market, as well.





"With this PI collection I tried to get closer to the original imperfections of the wood."

Designer *Alain van Havre* explained his inspiration last month at an exclusive press luncheon. It tried to introduce imperfections in standardised pieces as much as possible. This you can see on the unequal edges of the collection that are much closer to the shape of the original tree trunk.

Alain continued,

"The PI is based on the idea of reconnection.

It's about reconnection as roots of a tree to the ground.

It's a reconnection to the original shape of the material, wood.

There is nothing more beautiful than a tree that had a hard time to grow — twisted and with scars.

No straight lines but organic, nature-inspired shapes."



This release is part of the broader spring novelties launch, in which several collections are expanding with more design choices and forms.

While the PI collection has grown roots with the two dining chair designs, many of Ethnicraft's most loved collections are also 'growing roots,' including the bestselling Bok, Geometric, N701 and more.
